TO DEVELOP MINES.

Big Deal Made in Henderson by Outside Capital.

Hendersonville, N. C., June 30.— There were filed with the clerk of the superior court at Hendersonville today articles of incorporation of the Bell-Hansdom Mining company, the capital stock of the company being half a million dollars. Harris J. Pullen, of Colorado, is president of the company, Hon. George F. Wright is secretary, and D. D. Suttle, of this city, is one of the incorporators of and will be employed by the company. The company has purchased about three hundred acres of mineral rights, including the Bollston gold mine, on Forde mountain in Henderson county, and will begin active mining operations in from thirty to sixty days. The land purchased has been thoroughly tested by experts, and is considered a promising field for systematic mining.

The property was sold by W. A. Smith, M. C. Toms, C. F. Toms and F. E. A. Roberts. W. A. Smith has been employed as local counsel.

The mining property which has been transferred to this wealthy company is ten miles from Hendersonville. It lies on the south slope of Forde mountain. Running lengthwise of the mining company's property along the side of the mountain are four distinct mineral bearing veins. The veins average four feet in width and all lie between well defined walls. The average assay value of the ore at the surface is \$17.50 per ton, free milling. A two thousand-foot tunnel will be made in developing the veins of the mine.—Asheville Gazette.
