The Sun is in receipt of a copy Tacoma, Jan. 7.-The steamship Tacoma brings the news from Hong Kong that the American consul has required Viceroy North Carolina. As a part of the Kwang Yung to suppress several geography cuts of the leading seditious native newspapers circulated throughout Canton advising the natives to rise against foreigners. Some objection was made when the consul first protested. He pointed to the United States Monitor Monterey lying in the harbor as evidence that his wishes must be respected.
