A BEAUTIFUL SHOW.

HOME TALENT SCORED A TRIUMPH LAST NIGHT.

"My Wife and I" at the Opera House Last Night Was a Great Success. A Full House.

Salisbury's historic talent scored another triumph last night in the presentation of the beautiful play "My Wife and I." The audience was large and appreciative and the play was made manifest by frequent and rapturous applause.

It is to be doubted if any finer amateur theatrical has ever been presented in North Carolina. The best local talent was in the cast and thorough and conscientious work had been done in the rehearsal, with the most satisfactory results.

The stage setting was especially fine—in fact far superior to the scenic effects usually seen in the Salisbury theatres.

The play itself is a very pretty one, the plot being an interesting one, carrying the auditor along with every line and act. It is a pretty story of married life and the mistakes of a young couple. There is a touch of light to the pathetic and sympathetic features that vary what might otherwise be monotonous. These lines from Tennyson at the foot of the program conveyed an idea to the audience of the character of the play:

"We fell out, my wife and I,

For when we came where lies the child

We lost in other years,

GOLD HILL MINES.

Mr. Edwards Talks in New York About Them.

The New York Commercial Advertiser interviewed Mr. Richard H. Edwards, editor of the Manufacturers Record this week. In the course of the interview Mr. Edwards said:

The copper mining interests—and the south has vast stores of gold and copper ores—are for the first time being handled on a very broad scale, and the success of the Union Copper Company, which has expended \$1,600,000 in developing its mines and putting in its smelter at Gold Hill, N. C., gives some assurance that at last the development of these vast copper and gold ore resources will be pushed on as broad a scale as in the west. Already Pittsburgh capitalists have undertaken a mining development near the Union Copper property, and are preparing to spend \$4,000,000 in developing 40,000 horsepower on the Yadkin River for electric transmission as a part of their scheme, which it is now proposed to open on a large scale the old Gold Hill mine, of which it is said, English capitalists paid \$3,000,000 about in 1849 and which, after an output of about \$2,000,000 of gold prior to 1860, was shut down, partly because of some legal complications and partly because the veins contained so much iron pyrites that the copper, which could not then be successfully treated at that point.
