FROM THE TELEGRAPH.

Two Canadians reached April, Santos, in an Indian dhow, out canoe after sailing 6,400 miles.

Thieves took \$20,000 worth of diamonds from a Cincinnati jeweler's show window last night.

Admiral Caillard's French squadron reached the Turkish island of Mitylene and seized three ports.

The cigar-makers who were arrested in connection with Monday's disturbance in Havana, are still in jail.

The immense plant of Dilworth Porter & Co., manufacturers of steel rods and spikes, at Pittsburg, was damaged by fire last night to the extent of about \$250,000.

Yesterday morning four frame houses in course of construction in the suburbs of Newport News were destroyed by fire, which is believed to have been of incendiary origin.

The Standard Oil Company has declared a dividend of \$8 per share, payable December 16, making \$47 per share for the calendar year, which is the same amount as last year.

Barbers blew open the bank vault at Black Rock, Ark., last night and secured \$2,000 in cash and \$10,000 worth of pearls belonging to W. D. Bird, which had been placed in the vault for safe keeping. So quickly was the work done that the robbers escaped before the citizens, aroused by the explosion, got out of their houses.

Ten lives were lost and four buildings destroyed by a fire which started in the Klondike Theatre, at Hurley, Wis., yesterday. The charred remains of six of the victims have been recovered and search is being made for the others. Before the Klondike Theatre burned once before, in July, 1887, when eleven women lost their lives.

Florida's Good Luck.

Florida oranges are the best grown in the world. Until the great freeze eight years ago, Florida owners of orange groves were rich and prosperous. In one night their wealth was gone. Some of them have not been able to replant, but most of them have done so and the reports come of the outlook for a fine yield of oranges this season.

The Volusia (Fla.) Record says that wagon loads of corn are frequently seen on the streets extra-specially. The farmers planted extra big crops of corn, the yield was fine, and they have more corn than they can consume. In a year of corn scarcity, they are fortunate.
