Organization of Confederate Veterans.

The Beauties of Protection.
 Crawfordville (Ind.) Review.

When the delegation of miners
 from Clay county went over to "pay
 their respects" to Ben Harrison at
 Indianapolis last fall, it bore such
 banners as "Protection for the labor-
 ing man," "Harrison and Morton—
 Protection and prosperity." Many
 of the fellows composing the crowd
 are now objects of charity, and would
 greatly rejoice at the sight of a square
 meal. The "protection" comes in
 the way of an offer of about four dol-
 lars per week each from the coal
 mine operators for their labor. Such
 is another evidence of these "good
 Harrison times" and the beauties of
 protection.

Woolfolk Gently.
 Atlanta, Ga., June 24.—Tom Wool-
 folk was found guilty of murder in
 the first degree, by a jury trying
 him in Houston county, after a de-
 liberation of five minutes. Woolfolk
 murdered nine members of his fam-
 ily on the sixth of August, 1887. This
 is his fifth trial.

Cardinal Gibbons Attacks.
 Baltimore, June 27th, 1889.—A
 sensation was caused here yesterday
 at the regular quarterly meeting
 of the Ministerial Union by the reading
 of a bitter address on "The Bible in
 the Public Schools" by Rev. F. M. El-
 lis, D. D., pastor of the Eutaw Place
 Baptist church.

In the course of his remarks, he
 said: "I am also in favor of the
 Bible in the public schools because
 Rome is opposed to it. [Applause]
 During the recent Lenten lecture
 Cardinal Gibbons publicly advised
 and urged upon his people to read
 the Bible. Now I don't say that
 Cardinal Gibbons was not honest in
 that advice. But if he did not mean
 what he said he was not a good Cath-
 olic, and if he did not mean it he
 was not honest.

"The aim of the Catholic is to
 make Romanists, our aim is to make
 character. Rome controls all her
 people and therefore a Romanist can
 not be a good citizen of this Repub-
 lic. If the Pope had his way our
 Republic with its public school and
 the open Bible would soon go. Rome
 has already declared her intention,
 not only of driving the Bible from
 the public schools, but also of divid-
 ing the public school funds to her
 own advantage. The right of the
 church to educate is denied by Rome,
 and thus she openly antagonizes one
 of the leading institutions of our
 country."

The Union authorized Rev. Dr.
 Ellis to publish his paper.

"It is asserted upon the authority
 of men of the most undoubted re-
 publicanism in North Carolina that
 there has never been a time when
 such poor and unsatisfactory ap-
 pointments have been made by any
 President. The lowest and worst
 element in the Republican party in
 the State, the Sherman gang of
 tricksters and manipulators, have
 been lifted into power." "Judging
 of the future by the past, it is pre-
 dicted that these political buccaners
 will spend the next four years in
 feathering their nests and destroying
 the carefully built-up Republican
 party in the State."
