TOWN ORDINANCE.

Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the town of Salisbury,

Sec. 1. That every person in the town of Salisbury shall be required to keep the grass and weeds cut down on the street in front of his or her lot, or the lot occupied by him or her, and on failure to do so he or she shall be guilty of an misdemeanor and shall be fined five dollars.

Sec. 2. This ordinance shall be in force and take effect from and after the first day of January, 1892. Passed September 25, 1892.
