The sacred hand was elaborated, the contention being that all conscientious work and sacrifice for Christ's sake, done according to the directions of the scriptures, by any individual, will be sure to receive a proper reward both in this world and in that which is to come; but that all works not in accordance with the Divine word will be burned up and, which the individual will be saved, it will be "so as by fire" and he will suffer loss both now and in eternity.
