Miscellaneous News.

The electric plant at the penitentiary has been completed.

Compulsory education in North Carolina is gaining in favor very rapidly.

The population of Charleston is 55,807 against 54,956 in 1890, an increase of 857.

Mr. Bryan will be invited to speak in the first Congressional district of Maryland.

A family feud in Mississippi brings on a pitched battle between the factions.

German, Austrian and Italian troops will remain in Pekin if the Russians withdraw.

For the week ending August 25th there were 7,969 deaths from cholera in India.

A St. Louis company recently received an order from New Zealand for 68 passenger coaches.

Chung Li, former prefect of police of Pekin, goes to the Austrian headquarters and is arrested.

The political campaign in Kentucky was opened Monday in nearly every county in the State.

General McArthur reports a battle with the natives in one of the Southern Philippine islands.

Two cases of plague have been discovered in London, and more cases are reported at Glasgow.

They have a three-cornered campaign in Tennessee, there being 2 Republican candidates for governor in that State.

18 stokers of the British transport Mautcaim were arrested in New Orleans Tuesday charged with mutiny.

The Whitney Novelty Works at Aberdeen, Ind., was destroyed by fire recently. Loss, \$10,000 on machinery.

A man charged with robbing the bank at Williamsburg, Virginia, made his escape from the Richmond city prison recently.

Rev. Dr. Pearson, the distinguished evangelist, is suffering from very serious heart trouble. He has cancelled his engagements for some months to come.

Labor day was more generally observed in the South than ever before. At Chicago Roosevelt and Bryan lunched together and then addressed the men celebrating the day.

Raleigh, Sept. 4.—The handsome Presbyterian church here is about completed. It will be dedicated the last of this month. A memorial window is being made for it by Tiffany, of New York, and is in memory of the late Dr. William McPheters. It is being put in by his grandfather, Mrs. Sam Lyman, of New York.

No such spectacle was presented in any northern or western city, nor is anything of the kind possible there. A Spot of Perpetually Frozen Ground in Maryland.

Cumberland, Md., Special to Baltimore Sun.

George Stafford, a farmer and country school trustee, residing on the Williams road, six miles east of Cumberland, recently told of a remarkable freak of nature on his ground in Alleghany county.

A cave dug years ago, used for preserving vegetables and other edibles, kept them so cool that Mr. Stafford's sons concluded that there was a cold spring near the surface. In June last the boys started to dig, but were amazed to find the ground frozen so hard that it was impossible to penetrate it. The present month another attempt was made, but the ground was found to have thawed only 2 inches, being frozen hard beyond that point. One day this week a third attempt to dig was made, to find the condition of the ground unchanged. Mr. Stafford is of the opinion that there is a lake of ice under the ground. He says the soil is of the gravel variety and the ground is frozen until there are made big cracks out of which the coal air rushes in great volume.

Shirtwaist Wedding.

Camban, N. J., Sept. 3.—The marriage of Morris Blumstein and Miss Annie Jacobs, of this city, in Philadelphia last night was a shirtwaist affair in every particular.

Two weeks ago Miss Jacobs hit upon the idea and the cards announcing that it would be a "shirtwaist" wedding. Five hundred invitations were issued and the church was packed. Every man but Rev. Jacob Levy, who married them, was in his shirt sleeves. The church presented a novel sight. The ushers all wore white cambric shirts with gold studs, the gift of the groom, and the bride entered the church with her father, who was attired as the ushers, with the exception that he wore white studs. The groom, in a white silk shirt, white tie, black trousers and black belt, was attended by his best man, Morris Auerbach, in the same attire.—Baltimore Sun.
