### WE WILL NOT WITHDRAW.

#### RUSSIA NOW STANDS ENTIRELY ALONE.

Her Proposition to Evacuate Pekin meets with no Favor From any other Countries. Protection and Peace Wanted.

Washington, Sept. 5.—The allies are to stay in Pekin. Russia's proposal to withdraw the international troops from the Chinese capital will be rejected. Russia herself will probably modify her proposition. She will leave her troops and take their part in garrisoning the city. From preliminary advices received by this government from representatives abroad as to the probable tenor of the reports to be made by European governments to Russia. Officials here believe this will be the result of the interchange of notes on the proposition to evacuate Pekin. The present indications are that Germany, England, Italy and Austria will inform the Czar that they believe permanent and lasting peace and the future rights of foreigners in China can best be assured by negotiations conducted in the capitol of the Chinese empire. Japan will join in the majority and the United States has already declared her belief in the efficacy of this plan. Russia will thus be left alone, unless France should join her. Under these circumstances it is not believed, according to State department officials, that she will withdraw her troops and leave England and Japan in Pekin, where the advantage would be with them.

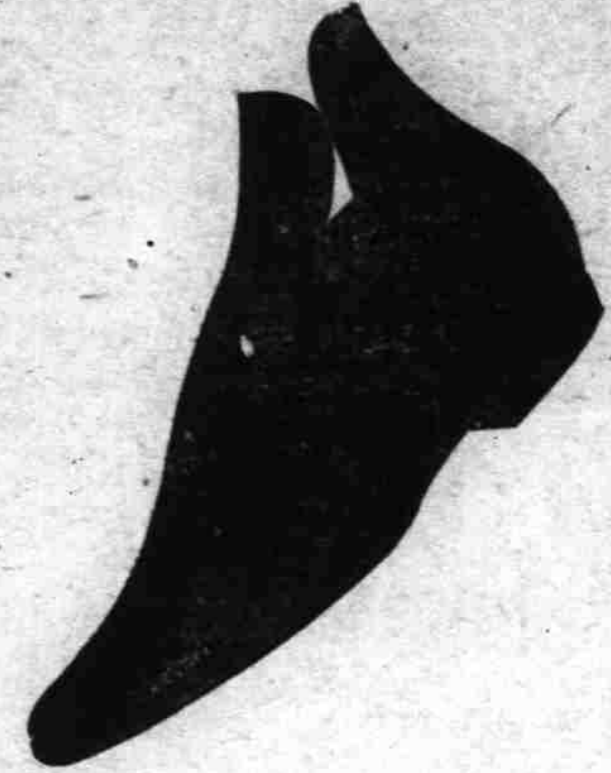
