Times.

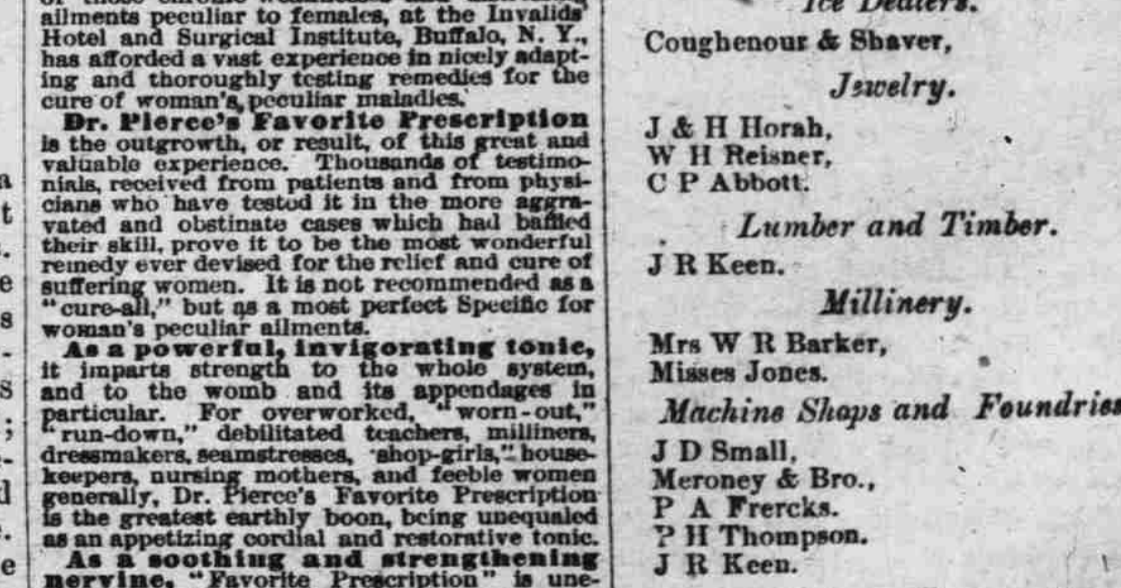
