NEWSPAPER LAWS.

As there are certain definite laws in relation to the rights of publishers often spapers, which do not seem to be understood, we will endeavor to make a plain synopsis of them and solicit attention thereto.

A Postmaster is required to give notice by letter, (returning a paper does not answer the law) when a subscri-ter does not take his paper out of the office, and state the reasons of its not being taken; and a neglect to do so makes the Postmastor responsible to the publisher for the

SPECIAL NOTICES.

2. Any person who takes a paper from the Post-Office whether directed to his name or another, or whether he had emberibed or not, is responsible for the pay.

5. If a person orders his paper discontinued, he must pay all arrearsgrs, or the publisher may continue to send it until payment is made, and collect the whole amount, whather it he taken from the office or not. There can be not legal discontinuance until the payment is made.

4. If the subscriber orders his paper to be stopped at a sertain time, and the publisher continues to send, the
