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92 DEAD HORSES. Buffalo Bill's Train Wrecked and Four Men Injured and 92 Horses Killed.

The little village of Linwood, 12 miles north of Salisbury, was the scene of an accident at 4 o'clock this morning, which will be heard of with regret by admirers of Col. W. F. Cody and his Wild West show.

Both engineers saw the danger in time to stop up though not to stop and the trains were only going about eight miles an hour at the time.

But it was among the horses that the greatest damage was done, 92 of the poor animals being either killed outright or having to be shot.

Engineer Lynch, of Salisbury, was in the cab of the engine of the freight train. He misread his orders and this led to the collision.
