A gen leman who was on the train tells us that it was tather a slowing up than a stop. There were a number of patiengers on board for Marshall come of whom succreded in se ambling out at the risk of life or limb, among whom was the unfortunate young lady; others could not get out but were carried on. It was inexcusable exercise of anthority on the part of the conductor, and an outrage to the passengers. We are sure the railroad authoricies will jus tify no such reckless and climinal abe es of power, and will hold the offender and all like him to strict accountability. At the same time the company cannot, if our infor mation is correct, e ear there sponsibility which has been thrown upen it.
