All the arrangements for the transfer of the Island of Cuba to the United States were completed Saturday, and Sunday the following program was carried out:

All the Spanish troops have gone aboard transports except the Tenth engineers, who remain ashore to give Spain's salute to American authority at noon, and eight hundred members of the Leon battalion, who do guard duty on the last day of Spanish sovereignty in Cuba. The Leon battalion boarded a transport this morning. The Tenth engineers will remain in the Morro and Cabanas until shortly after twelve o'clock. When their salute has been fired they will go aboard the transport *Buenos Ayres*. **GENERALS' SONS WILL RAISE FLAGS.**

The American flag was raised over Morro Castle by Lieutenant Wade, son of General Wade, that over Cabanas by Lieutenant Lee, son of General Lee, and that over the palace by Major Butler, son of General M. C. Butler.

Besides General Brooke and his staff and the members of the American commission, General Davis, commander of the American forces in Pinar del Rio province were present at the ceremony in the palace. The Spanish representatives were Captain General Castellanos, Margus Montoro and Secretary Girault, of the commission.

The other member of the Spanish commission, Vice Admiral Manóla, sailed on the auxiliary cruiser *Rapido*, which left today. The *Patriota* also left, and the torpedo gunboats *Eusebio*, *Molina*, *Galicia* and *Diego Velasquez* will sail tonight. The transport *Stuttgart* went to Matanzas to take troops from there.

The Leon battalion today has had a lonesome vigil. It guarded the palace and the wharves that belong to it. No visitors were permitted and no business was transacted except that incident to closing up of the various offices. General Brooke's aids visited it and completed the arrangements for today's ceremony. The American military commanders all praise the dignified attitude and courteous actions of Spanish General Castellanos and the other Spanish officials who remain to complete the function of transferring the sovereignty of the island.

**TENTH INFANTRY CAMPS IN PRADO.**  
 Havana is fully prepared for the change. The city has a funeral quiet. The only stir was when the Tenth Infantry moved its camp and pitched

tents along the Prado, in the heart of the town. This is the first city camp to be established.

After the parade of the American troops others may be located here temporarily.

American and Cuban flags are floating together from many public buildings. The Cubans are quiet, but are not taking much interest in tomorrow's proceedings.

Besides the palace and the castles Morro and Cabanas, there will be turned over to the American authorities the arsenal, naval station, the Custom House, the building occupied by the port officers and the Machine wharf. All other forts and public buildings are already in the possession of the American authorities. The floating dock, which is Spanish property, will remain in the harbor under the command of Naval Captain Perel until the Spanish Minister of Marine directs its removal.

Arrangements have been completed for the Americans to take over the administration of the Custom House, telegraph lines and Post Office at the opening of business on Monday morning.
