Although the General Assem bly has not been in session a week we are able to give our readers an outhine with some modications and amendment that will probably be submitted to the people of the State for ratification at the gree the negro vote, and while this is trne, no white man will be deprived of the right of suffrage The bill is divided into ten sec tions, and was introduced into the House by Mr. Winston, o Bertie,
Sections 1 and 2 requires the voter to be 21 years of age, and a bona fide resident of the State year and of the precinct in which he proposes to rote six months But no person who has beeu con victed or confessed his guilt in open court upon indictment of the following crimes: bribery, burglary in any degree, larceny receiving stolen goods, arson rury, rape, sale of cotton i rohm rime whereof the punishmen may be imprisonment in the pen iteutiary, shall be permitted to
vote unless restored to citizenvote unless restored to citizen-
ship as provided by law, and it shall not be necessary that any punishment has been imposed to bring persons within the pro hibition of this section.
Then again. Every person presenting himself for registrawrite intelligently, and he shal demonstrate his ability to do so when he applies for registration by making under oath, adminis tered to him by the officer hav ug in charge such registration or by his duputy, both of whom are hereby authorized to adminion therefor upon a blank to urnished by such officer.
The satd application shall contain the necessary informato register and vote, and shall be entirely writton, dated and signed by him, in the present of the registration officer or his suggestion from any person or memorandum whatever, except the form of application herein set forth.
Section 6. Provides that if the write as above provided, then he wite as above provided, then he
ion; and no male person who was naturalized prior to the first day cf January, 1900 , shall be denied the right to register and vote in this State by reason of his failure to possess the edcational or property qualifica tution; provided he shall have resided in this State for five (5) years next preceding the the egistration, and shall have rey stered in accordance with the terms of this Article prior to eptember 1, 1900: and no person shall be entitled to register under this section after said date Sec. 8 . Provides for the payment of poll tax of all persons nder the age of 60 years; and provides that no such person such payment is made on or before the 31st day of December of each year for the two (2) years preceding the year in which he
offers to vote. All between the ages of 21 and 60 not herein exempted come within this provis. ion.

It is also required by this sec tion that the poll tax receipt for said time shall be exhibited to the election officer in official loss, or duplicate in event of such poll tax shall be produced by the affidavit of the party to whom it was paid.
Sec. 10. Defines who shall be eligible to office. Also provides for the submission of this Amend ment|to the Constitution to the voters of the State for ratifica-tion-"'on the Tuesday after the first Monday in May, 1900." The election is to be conducted and held under the same rules and regulations as are provided in this State and in force May 1 1899 -that is to to say, unde the new election law to be passed by the present General Assem-
Whether this bill will pass as above we can not tell, but of one thing we may be assured, some measure of like character will be submitted to the people.
