News in General.

There are five negroes in the legislature. It is almost certain this is the last legislature in the State in which the negro will appear as a member.

S. Otho Wilson, who claims still to be railroad commissioner, sent in his resignation Saturday. He only hopes to receive salary since his suspension.

A call has been issued to the Confederate veterans to meet in Raleigh on January 25th for the purpose of formulating some practical method for the presentation of the claims of indigent Confederate veterans to the legislature.

The Republican legislative caucus at Raleigh Saturday night adopted resolutions expelling Isaac H. Smith, the colored banker and representative from Craven county, from the Republican caucus because he voted for Connor for speaker and was not true to his party in various other ways.

At Greenville in 1890 Messrs John King and Joe Rawls had a difficulty over a mule. They shot each other with pistols, King being shot in the hip and Rawls through the leg. King died from the wound. Rawls fled and eluded arrest for nine years. For a year or so past he had been living in Bertie county under an assumed name. He was arrested last Thursday and was taken to Greenville Friday.

The new deaf and dumb building at Morganton is being rapidly completed and will be ready for occupancy by April 1st. This will give the institution a capacity to accommodate 300 pupils. There are now 199 pupils, 80 applications on file and Supt. Goodwin has the names of 100 more who should be admitted.

Superintendent Tillery, of the penitentiary farms, has dismissed 27 negro guards from the Caledonia farm—thus making a clean sweep of negro guards.

Andrew Carnegie has secured a contract for 40,000 tons of steel rails for South Africa, underbidding English rail makers nearly \$4 a ton. But still our rail makers must have tariff protection against the English and other foreign rail makers.

The Diamond Shoals light ship parted her anchor chain Monday, and, according to a telegram received by the United States weather bureau she passed in the capes Tuesday.

Diamond Shoals, Cape Hatteras, is one of the most dangerous places upon the coast and for the present unguarded. Numerous attempts have been made to erect a lighthouse, all of which have failed. Light ship No. 63 has, however, for about a year, managed to withstand the heavy seas and fierce gales, which sweep over the shoals; but Monday it was swept from its moorings.

A dispatch from Washington says:

Among Southern Senators opposition to ratification of the Paris peace treaty is growing. Senator Money of Mississippi was at first favorable to it, has now come out against it. Senator Martin of Virginia is against it. Senator Pritchard is quoted for it and Senator Butler against it. The trouble in Holio, has had the effect of making some Senators who have heretofore expressed themselves in favor of the treaty, hesitate about finally committing themselves to ratification. Sentiment in the House against expansion is growing stronger.

The latest news from the Philippines is not very assuring. Aguinaldo has issued a second proclamation against Americans couched in language more violent than that in his first manifesto. A few copies of the proclamation were posted about the city of Manila, but were torn down by order of General Otis.

Many natives here are fearful of the outcome, and the exodus to the interior continues. It is not believed by the authorities that the insurgents will be foolish enough to attack Manila but should they do so they will meet a warm reception, as the Americans are prepared for an emergency.
