COMMUNICATION.

MR. EDITOR:—It has been suggested, or rather requested that I seek to have enacted a "Dispensary Law" for Beaufort county. Knowing this to be a measure in which almost the entire people of Beaufort are interested and knowing further that it was not a campaign question and while there seems to be here a rapidly growing sentiment in favor of a dispensary system, largely throughout the entire State, yet, appreciating my allegiance to the will of my people I can not and will not passively submit to the passage of any law of public interest without due notice to the people of my county. Whatever may be my personal convictions, majorities and minorities, on all questions of public interest, may rest assured that they will receive due and proper notice of the introduction of any bill of this character or of any other of such public interest. I call attention to this measure for two reasons, to-wit: First—Because I have received some letters of inquiry about a dispensary law for Beaufort, subsequently to a suggestion or request of the passage of such a law. Second—Because, should such a bill be prepared and sent to me for introduction, while I could and would hold it up before committee and give notice to my people, it would be my duty to introduce by request. Therefore, I regard it as eminently proper, in a matter of this importance, to give the people a longer time to consider and investigate such a measure, than they could possibly have, should I be requested during the latter part of the session, to introduce by request such a bill.

I wish to say further that I will not make any disclosure of names of persons making such requests or writing such letters, unless I am requested to introduce such bill then, a matter of course, it will become a known fact who the drafter of the bill is. I suggest that such a measure be considered, so as to avoid rush and under consideration in the event that I am requested to introduce such a bill later on in the session.

I desire to further call attention to the bill on public roads published in News and Observer on January 25th, and suggest that our county papers publish the proposed road law and get a consensus of opinion. I shall be glad to know what

PRITCHARD'S AMENDMENT.

Looking to Care of Confederates' Graves Introduced in the Senate.

Washington, Jan. 27.—Senator Pritchard today introduced in the Senate his amendment to the appropriation bill which is designed to be the first step toward carrying out the suggestions of the President for the care of the Confederate graves. This amendment provides for an appropriation for the preliminary work. It is as follows: To enable the Secretary of War to make a thorough examination and report to Congress as to the number of Confederate cemeteries in the United States and the location thereof, and the number of Confederate soldiers buried in other than Confederate cemeteries and the location of such cemeteries with the view to ascertain the best method of caring for the Confederate cemeteries and also for removal where practicable or desirable of Confederate dead from private cemeteries to Confederate cemeteries, the sum of \$10,000.

As the amendment explains on its face, it provide simply for paving the way for the work. This is probably all that will be done by this Congress, but after the information has been ascertained it is fully expected that the work will go on and that the graves, especially in distinctive Confederate cemeteries will be cared for.
