Lumber is being hauled on the vacant lot opposite J. W. Chapin's for the erection of a large two story school building.

Col. Alexander Hudnell has bought the two large tracts of land near this place, formerly owned by Capt. Mason Bonner and Sylvester Brown of Washington.

Commissioners have been appointed and met and have assessed each land owner and located the boundary lines of the no fence section. It embraces all the lands between South Creek on the East and the sand hills on the West. The fence is to be built and all stock taken up within the next fifteen days.

**To Care for Schools.**

The following is the full text of the bill now a law, that removes the County Board of Education and appoints in their stead a County Board of Directors. The first section of the act names the directors of three for each county. Those named for Beaufort county are Alex. Hudnell, E. W. Ayers, and J. A. H. Tankard; for Hyde county S. S. Mann, T. H. R. Gibbs, and Claude W. Davis.

Section 2.—The Secretary of State shall within ten days after the ratification of this act, send a certified copy of the members of the county board of school directors for the respective counties, to the Clerk of the Superior Court of each county in the State, whereupon the said clerk shall immediately notify each member of his appointment and direct said members to meet at the court house on the second Monday in April for the purpose of organizing said board.

Section 3.—That this act shall be in force from and after its ratification.

**General News.**

The Legislature has appropriated \$100,000 for the public schools.

tire has passed the Legislature but unfortunately it only applies to a few counties and we regret that Beaufort county is not one of them.

Dr. Abbott of the railroad commission says that after April 4th, when under the provisions of the new act, the railroad commission ceases to exist, he will institute suit to test the right to thus oust him, as he has four years yet to serve. He has not as yet conferred with E. C. Beddingfield regarding the matter. The case, in the shape of a friendly suit, will come up at the April term of Wake court.

The latest dispatches from Manila indicate we may expect important news from that quarter in a few days and Gen. Otis having completed his plans will make a movement which will drive the insurgents from power. It is probable that Gen. Otis will form a large part of his force into three columns as soon as his reinforcements arrive and will push them in parallel lines through the jungles clearing out the insurgents in every direction as the troops advance. To accomplish this will take some sharp and decisive fighting.

The local Daughters of the Confederacy located at Savannah have adopted resolutions strongly protesting against President McKinley's suggestion respecting the Federal care of Confederate graves. The resolution says:

"With full appreciation of the impulse expressed in that sentiment, we shrink instinctively, with hushed and holy sorrow, from yielding the slightest assent. The graves of the Confederate dead are our pilgrim shrines. From their hallowed hearts eternally ascend mute protests against all assaults upon constitutional liberty. The record these incomparable heroes made furnish the brightest pages in American annals, wrought out by men of loftiest mould. Only reverent hands should lay memorials over their consecrated graves. To the women of the South, this sacred trust must be reserved through all generations."
