### ALLIED SUCCESS NOTED IN WEST AND EAST

#### Greater Battle Soon Expected

While the Serbs and their French allies are wrestling from the Bulgarians some of the strongest positions they have held in Macedonia for the past two years, Marshal Foch's forces are nibbling successfully at the German lines on the western front in the face of more determined resistance.

Another victory has been recorded for the American, British and French on the newly constituted eastern front. Detachments of the Allies have routed Bolshevik forces in the vicinity of Archangel and it is reported many of the Red Guard officers went over to the Allies when their men fled in panic.

The near east furnished the most sensational news of the day. The offensive which has been launched there seems not only the most successful but the most pretentious in many months. It appears probable that a further advance by the Franco-Serbian troops will necessitate the recall of the Bulgarian divisions which have been loaned to Emperor William to bolster the Teuton resistance in France and Flanders.

Serbian Take Prisoners. An official Serbian report declares that the reconstituted army of the battered but not beaten little kingdom has taken not only 3,000 prisoners but an important park of cannon. The Bulgars admit having retired, but declare the attack has been checked to the north of Gradeshitza. There is nothing to indicate, however, that the advance of the Serbs and French has been definitely held up.

Heavy Blow Impending. The lull in the fighting in the west is regarded by military critics as merely the prelude to further heavy blows at the foe by the American, British and French armies.

French Forging Ahead. General Petain's veterans are forging ahead slowly but surely in their grim and desperate struggle for the St. Gobain forest which the Germans have been ordered to hold at all costs. Not only is the position a natural citadel but the Teutons have fortified it in every way their ingenuity could devise. Notwithstanding the difficulty of their task, however, the French are moving on, taking prisoners as they go.

On the American front the past 24 hours have been the quietest since General Pershing's command launched its irresistible drive against the St. Mihiel salient. There are indications that the Germans intend to retire behind the Hindenburg line in this sector. They are burning villages along the Moselle and in other sections. This procedure usually is a preliminary to a retreat.

Ancient History Already. The Austrian peace note appears already to have become almost ancient history. The blunt and unmistakable refusal of President Wilson to parley with the Central Powers except upon the terms he previously has laid down seems to have voiced the sentiments of the Entente. They are likely to let the reply of the United States suffice for all as they did in the case of the Papal peace proposal.

Towns and Villages Captured by Allies. London, Sept. 18.—The British have penetrated the enemy's defenses northwest of St. Quentin to a depth of three miles and captured more than 6,000 prisoners, Field Marshal Haig reports tonight.

The high ground south of Gouzeaucourt has been carried by the British, who reached the outskirts of Villers-Guislain and occupied Gauche wood.

British Bomb Bruges. London, Sept. 18.—British army and navy aviators in the last 48 hours have dropped thirteen tons of bombs on the docks at Bruges and a German airbase in Belgium, says an official statement from the Admiralty today. In air fighting 11 German airplanes were destroyed.
