JAPAN BOOSTS RICE HARVEST

Enlarged Production Due More to Improved Methods Than Increase In Acreage.

Tokyo.—While Japan does not produce sufficient rice for the needs of her people, who, even after an elaborate banquet, require a bowl or more of their staple food, production has kept pace with the increase of the population. In the early days of the Maiji reign, when the population was 35,000,000, there was 35,000,000 koku of rice produced. This year, with a population of 70,000,000, the crop is estimated at an equal number of koku. The increase in production is due more to improved methods than greater acreage under cultivation.

YANKS MAY SAVE RICE FIELDS
