The Lord's Supper.
Lesson for May 26th. Matt. 26:17-30.
Golden Text: 1 Corin. 11:24.
The first fact to bear in mind about the Lord's Supper is that it is a feast of commemoration. Inspired by the precious words of the Scripture, "This do in remembrance of me," the Holy Communion is a celebration of remembrance. As the Lord's Supper is a most useful service, it is very easy, in the midst of the bustle and bustle of crowded days, to lose sight of its meaning.

Dr. James Moffatt once said that the Lord's Supper is a feast of remembrance. Early in the Christian era the common name for the sacrament was the "Eucharist," meaning "act of giving thanks." We will remember that Jesus and his disciples gathered in the Upper Room to observe the passover, that the celebrating the deliverance from the angel of death in Egypt. Obviously the passover was a joyous feast, and the Holy Communion, its successor, is also a feast of gratitude.

Finally, the Lord's Supper is a communion of fellowship, a testimony to the unity of God's people, a gracious rite. It is their supreme act of worship. The 231 millions of Roman Catholics, the 144 millions of Greek Orthodox adherents, and the 207 millions associated with the Protestant bodies hold this sacrament in the highest esteem.

and treated her injuries. The pistol ball had struck her breast and penetrated her arm. Dr. Peete stated that the woman told him she had shot her and that he and the officer found where the pistol ball went through screen wire and struck the wall after tearing through the flesh of the woman. Davis who had at one time been confined to an institution for the mentally deranged, was sentenced by Judge Devin to three years in State Prison.

The alleged sale of ten cents worth of liquor cost Mac Moore six months of his liberty when he was convicted in Superior court on a charge of possessing and transporting whiskey for the purpose of sale.

The case, which had been appealed from Recorder's court, was heard in the channels of court by Mrs. Wiley James in an attempt to remove the drink temptation from her husband. Both she and her husband, as well as their son, testified that they went to Moore's home and that Moore hid them a small quantity of whiskey for ten cents. Mr. James testified that he had stopped at Moore's place on many occasions and bought whiskey. His little son testified that he had been with his father a number of times when he stopped at Moore's.

The negro testified that he had never sold any whiskey and that the day he came there with Mrs. James he did not sell him any. He said that Mrs. James asked him to never have a little, claiming there was sickness in the family, and that he told her he did not have a drop. Moore testified that later the James family came to his house and he sold Mrs. James a small quantity of whiskey from a jar which had been left with him and another negro in the yard during the absence of Mr. and Mrs. James. He said another negro on the stand substantiated his testimony regarding the whiskey being left in the yard by some unknown man and the transaction with Mrs. James.

After the jury had returned its verdict of guilty and counsel for the defendant had appealed for a new trial on behalf of his client, Judge Moore stated that Moore was the one to put out of business and was going to put him out of business for six months.
