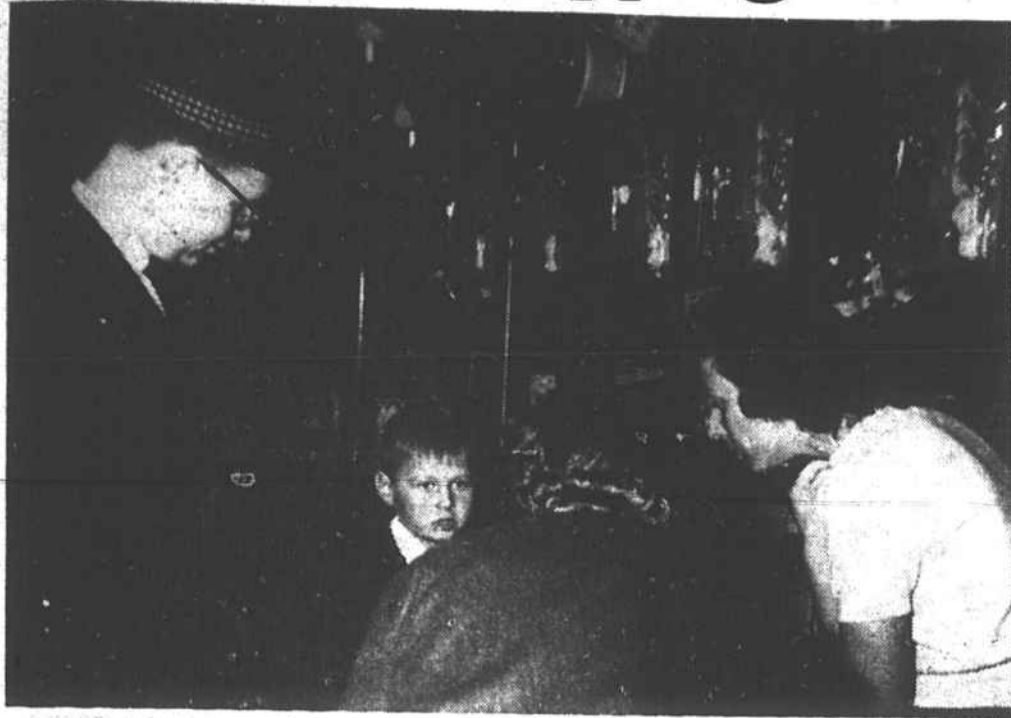


# Christmas Shopping Tour For Needy Children Is Held Here

Ten children from the Afton school and 22 youths from the Warrenton school were taken on a tour of a large Warrenton store. The children were each given \$2.50 with which to purchase items for themselves or gifts for friends and relatives.

It was in this store that one little fellow with shining face looked up at Monroe Gardner and said, "I think you are the best man in the world." A woman standing nearby wept unashamed.

Following the shopping tour, the children were given a party at Reid's Pastry Shop here by A. L. Reid, a member of the local Jaycee club.
