# High School Graduates Need Further Training

High school graduates may be cheating themselves if they do not receive further training. If everyone desired to be a doctor, would not this be tragic? The same is true of county agents, veterinarians,

teachers, preachers, farmers, store operators, etc.

**N. C. Agricultural Institute**

Since this county is mainly rural, a large percent of our boys graduating from high school are from the farms or closely associated with agriculture. For some years the county agricultural agent in N. C. have seen a need for a 2-year course in various phases of agriculture. After considerable

talk and urging, such a course has been set up at State College and will start the first class in September 1960.

**Admission Requirements**

1. An application must be submitted to the Director of Admissions, N. C. State College, Raleigh, N. C.

2. Each application must be accompanied with a copy of the applicant's high school record or a letter indicating that the applicant has passed the Certifying exam administered by the State Dept. of Public Instruction.

3. A letter of recommendation from a responsible citizen, not a relative, who can attest to the applicant's integrity and character is required.

4. The regular college entrance exam will not be required for applicants interested in registering in the Agricultural Institute.

**Admission by Certificate of Graduation or Certifying Exam**

1. Applicants should be of sound moral character and a graduate of an accredited high school.

2. A mature individual who has not graduated from an accredited high school, or has not completed his high school requirements may take a special exam of certification administered by the State Department of Public Instruction and be admitted.

Certification of completion will be awarded in lieu of degree from the following courses:

1. Farm Equipment Sales and Service
2. General Agriculture
3. Livestock Managers and Technicians
4. Pest Control Operators
5. Poultry Technician

These courses are excellent and we highly recommend them to the individual not desiring to take the regular BS degree.
