HOLT NAMED Norlina Post Office Construction Should

Commissioner H. W. Holt has been elevated to the position of chairman of the Water Committee of the Town of Warrenton and Commissioner A. C. Fair has been added to this committee.

Mayor W. A. Miles, at the regular meeting of the board Monday night, appointed Holt as chairman of the Water Committee to succeed former Commissioner Beverly White who resigned a few weeks ago in protest of the action of the board in a police shakeup. Holt was already a member of the board and A. C. Fair was added to complete the committee

No action was taken by the board Monday night to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of White.

Action in the recent police shakeup which saw the employment of R. D. Chewning as police chief and the release of Officer Claude Bottoms was taken in an executive session and for this reason it was not stated in a newspaper account that Bottoms was given sever-ance pay. Monday night the commissioners asked that it be stated that in releasing Officer Bottoms he was given a full months severance pay.
