State Has Surplus Of Pine Seedlings; Land Owners Urged To Place Orders

The State Forestry Service has launched a statewide publicity campaign in an effort to sell 50 million surplus pine seedlings. "We grew 85 to 90 million of the seedlings this year and have orders for about 35 million at the present time," said State Forester Fred Claridge. "We are making every effort to sell the rest." He said the Forestry Service is distributing 22,000 promotional posters and a large quantity of circulars. "Several banks have agreed to include the circulars in their monthly bank statements," he added. A major factor in the seedling surplus is the termination at the end of this month of the federal government's Soil Bank true planting program. "When the program was at its peak we were selling seedlings almost as fast as we could grow them," said Claridge. "We sold 63 million last year and 98 million the year before."

AGRICULTURE IN 1961-1965
A high level of farm production will continue during the next 3-5 years. This increased output will be produced with fewer farm workers. It has been estimated that in the next five years the number of farm workers will decline between 750,000 and 1,000,000. This assumes a strong non-farm economy to give continued job opportunities.
In order to attain this high level of output, farmers will purchase more of their production input, including chemicals, equipment, fertilizer and other supplies. The cost of these items will likely show for this increase during the 3-5 year period.
Our population will approach 200 million by 1965, and farm exports will probably be strong. This does not mean, however, that our major farm problems will disappear or even decline sharply in the next five years. High supplies coupled with high costs gives little reason for optimism in terms of total net farm income.
It should be noted, however, that any major change in government policy with respect to agricultural exports and on farm production controls could mean a drastic change in net

agricultural income.
Warren Farmers 1961-65
In the next 3-5 years more people will continue to leave the farm. These people will seek other areas for employment, whether it be farm or non-farm, mostly industrial employment. Why? For steady, regular and higher prices of farm products. Increased mechanization and farm consolidation meaning fewer farms but larger farms—utilizing mechanical equipment and power will release farm labor. Farm efficiency will result in higher net farm income due to better use of land, labor and capital. Increased production by use of chemicals, equipment, seeds, fertilizer — influencing quality and quantity products.
To meet, compete and stay ahead, get ahead and share in the total prosperity we must efficiently utilize modern production methods as they are developed. This means a change in attitudes, skills and knowledge, that is if you're really planning "to make the best better."
