The forms will be obtainable from any bank and postoffice in Warren County. Questionnaires will also be available from the Employment Security Commission's Henderson office, from Warren County farm agents' offices and from various area business firms. In addition, distribution will be speeded by Warren County school children who may get the forms at school and return the completed forms to their teachers. The labor survey for Warren County—and for would-be factory personnel in adjoining

counties—was prompted by an unnamed industry's recent request for worker information, Benton said.

"Many persons throughout this area have expressed interest in the Bute Development Company's program to stimulate industrial location in this area," Benton said. "Now these persons will have an opportunity to actively aid in the program."

A RESOLUTION BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWN OF NORLINA CALLING A REGULAR ELECTION FOR THE PURPOSE OF ELECTING A MAYOR AND THREE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Norlina that, in accordance with the General Laws of the State of North Carolina, the Board of Commissioners hereby calls for an election to be held in the Mayor's Office on Tuesday, May 2, 1961, the same being the first Tuesday after the date established by law for said election. Said election shall be conducted for the purpose of electing a Mayor and three Commissioners by the voters of the Town. The Mayor and each Commissioner shall be elected to hold office for a term of two years, and until their successors are elected and qualified.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all persons eligible to vote in the Town of Norlina, as defined by general law, shall be eligible to register and vote in the election hereinafter called.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Registrar be and he is hereby directed to open the registration books for the purpose of recording therein the names of all persons eligible to be registered who did not register for the last preceding municipal election.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Registrar shall open said books at 9:00 A. M. on Saturday, April 15, 1961, and shall keep said books open each day for seven (7) days, excluding Sunday, for the registration of any new electors entitled to register from 9:00 A. M. until 5:00 P. M., except on Saturdays, when the books shall remain open until 9:00 P. M.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Saturday, April 22, 1961, shall be designated as Challenge Day, and that any person desiring to challenge any name included in said registration books shall on this day advise the Registrar and Judges of this fact. The Registrar and Judges shall thereupon set a date and a time for the hearing of the challenge, but said date shall be prior to Monday, May 1, 1961.

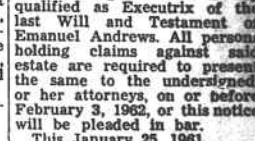
