

Approval of a junior high for Warrenton and Macon students was given by the Board of Education on Macon school district. Dr. Tom Holt acted as spokesman for the group.



The Health Department, Dr Jones said, would like to re mind all those who have not availed themselves of this service that there is still time to bring dogs to the Animal Clinic in Warrenton, on the Norlina Road, to be immunized be fore the penalty of an extra dollar goes into effect.


Andrews To Hold W. Plains Revival
