Fires Since Last Edition
 On Tuesday night, December 26, the Company was called to a brush fire on the J. Boyd Davis farm on the Norlina road. About ten men answered the call with the woods truck and the emergency car. The fire was confined to about one-half acre. Time out 45 minutes.

On Saturday night, December 30, the Company answered a call to the Ernest Lyons home on No Bottom Road. About 15 men showed up with two fire trucks and the emergency car. The fire was extinguished, but the house was considered a total loss. No one was at home at the time. The fire was noticed by a neighbor after it had broken through the roof. Time out about 2 1/2 hours.

On Sunday afternoon, December 31, the Company was called to the home of Stanley Williams in the Hecks Grove Community. About seven men answered the call, and this was a total loss. This call was answered with two fire trucks and emergency car; also truck from Inez Auxiliary. Time out 1 1/2 hours.

Again, let us remind you of the importance of giving complete details about the fire, including the exact location. Always say who is calling. We know you will be excited when reporting a fire, but be as calm as possible when calling. Be sure the person answering the call understands before you hang up.

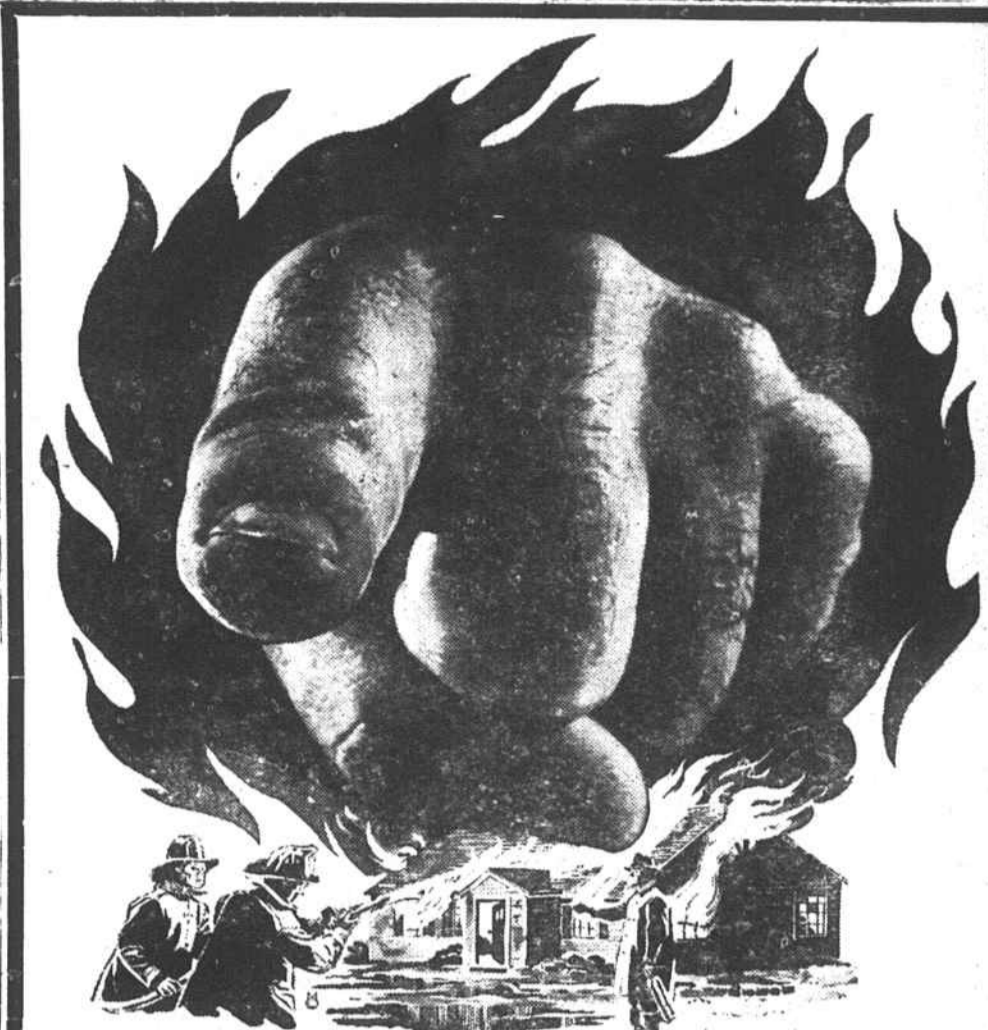
