er of the House of Representatives, and with the execption of William Miller who served as Speaker for three consecusessions, 1812, 1813 and 1814, is the only other citizen of Warren County who has served as Speaker. Mr. Kerr has also served as Chairman of the House Appropriations Committee in 1941, and Chairman of the House Finance Committee in 1945.
