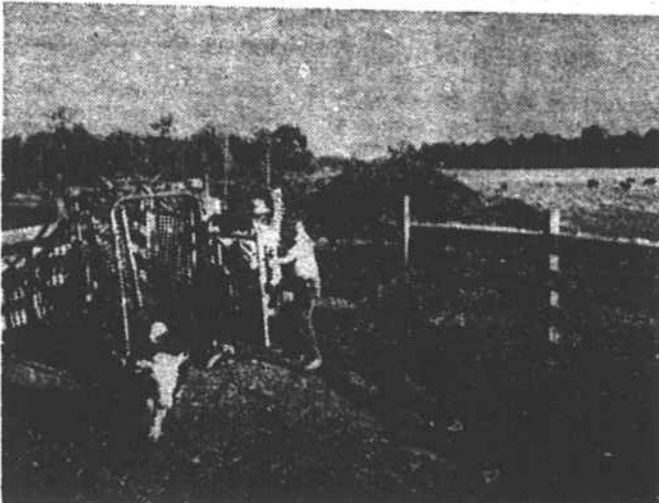

**PERFORMANCE TESTING OF BEEF CATTLE**

The objective of this activity compares with the Dairy Herd Improvement Association program among dairy farmers. Cooperating beef producers pay fees for this service similar to DHIA. # 1962 Rabies Vaccination Clinics

North Carolina State Law requires all dogs four months of age and over to be vaccinated against Rabies. The vaccination fee will be \$2.00 per dog during the month of February, March and April. After April 30th., the vaccination fee will be \$3.00 per dog. Effective May 1st., all dogs found without vaccination tags and collars will be subject to impoundment by the Warren County Dog Warden and the owners thereof will be subject to legal action.
