Rural Community Development Goals For 1962

Since Rural Community De velopment is a group-action program, with thte objective of people coming together to help in the development of community, county, and self, we have to keep in mind the changes rapidly being made that influence our growth and development - changes that us to direction -changes that tell us we will change-regardless of whether it is forward or backward.

Since the last five years Warren County has lost 611 non-white farm families. We now have 1,301 non-white farm families residing in this county. There are 683 owners and part owners, 618 tenants and sharecroppers; 48.3 % of all land in cultivation is by nonwhites. Also, this county ranks 14th from the bottom in per capita income-and there are 100 counties in North Carolina. What can Rural Community Development do to increase

First, 150 farm families can add one brood sow to their program and top out 20 pigstotaling 3,000 tops. Today's market price of \$15.00 per hundred pounds would bring \$30.00 per pig, times 3,000 liams. hogs-equally \$90,00 income.

> A lot of the pruning can be done during the growing season by cutting long or short stems depending on the growth by the plant. If this is done about the only other pruning necessary is to remove diseased branches just before growth starts in the spring. roses with exceptional vigor should be pruned to 3 to 5 canes and these cut back to about two feet. The less vigorous ones can be left alone except for thinning out and removing diseased wood. This type pruning should be done bout the time growth starts. With Climbing roses it is largely a matter of keeping the thinned out and the branches shortened when necessary. Light pruning can be done at any time. Early spring just before growth starts is a good time to do the thinning out. Get busy—and beautify your
