Good Cover Crops Will Protect The Farm Pond

A farm pond is an excellent instrument to measure soil erosion on the land draining into the pond.

Where land is cultivated there is invariably some erosion. Research has shown that contour cultivation alone will cut soil erosion in half.

A pond that gets muddy often is a very poor fish-pond. Silt that accumulates on the bottom of a pond makes it hard for fish to spawn and is very detrimental.

Soil Conservation is necessary to maintain high crop yields, to maintain the land for future generations, to have a sound economic operation on the farm and for many other reasons.

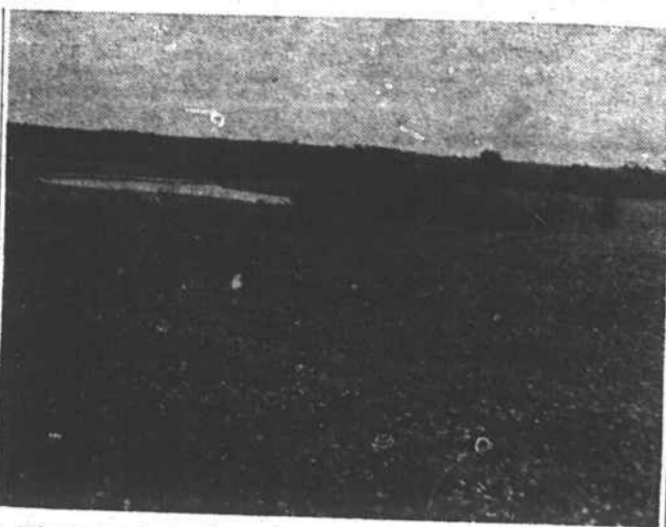
