The award of \$190,000 was made by Hugh W. Holt, M. P. Burwell, Jr., and W. B. Elling-ton, commissioners appointed by the court for the purpose of appraising the 533 acres and timber which is part of a 1500-acre tract owned by the defendants.

In a judgment addressed to the Clerk of Court, the commissioners held that the just compensation and damages should be \$190,000 and that the defendants will receive no benefits from the construction

of the Gaston Dam. Before making the award, the three commissioners spent three days touring the lands, hearing witnesses and listening to arguments by attorneys. The award was made on last


