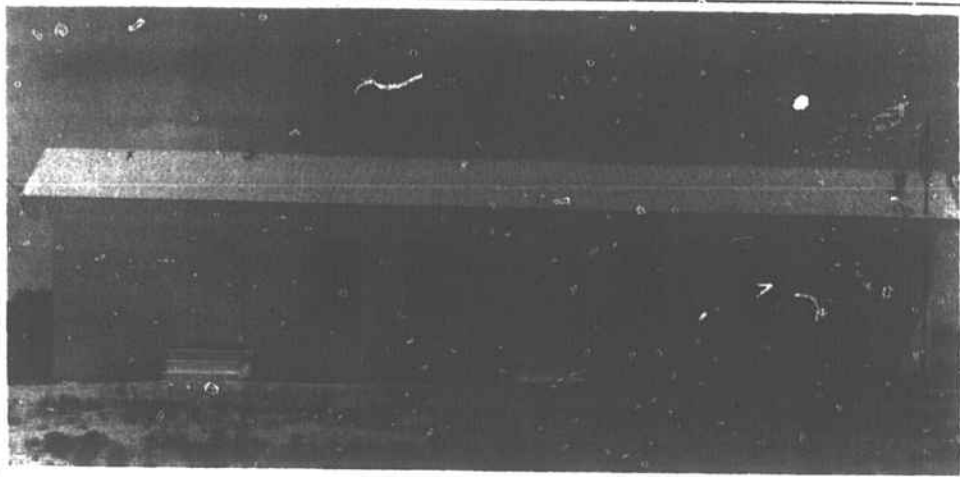
Three Defendants Given Stiff Fines In Recorder's Court
