\$110,000 of bonds for the improvement and enlargement of the Sanitary Sewer System of the Town by the construction of a plant for the treatment and disposal of sewage including the installation of a pumping station and force main, together with the acquisition and installation of the necessary equipment, machinery, and apparatus and the acquisition of the lands or rights in land required therefor.

Objections set forth in said statement shall be in the consideration of said Commission in its determination of whether or not it may hold a public hearing as provided by law on the matter of the
