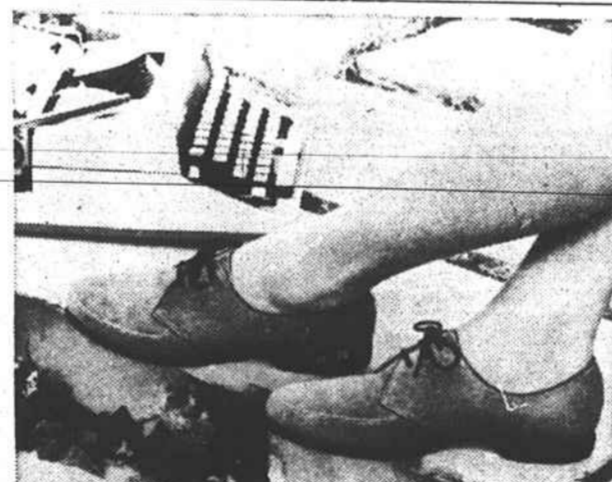


REV. M. M. HUTTON
