

Christmas Holidays Under Way

A Christmas holiday, ranging in length from a single day to two weeks, is in store for most Warren County residents.

The more than 6,000 public school children and scores of teachers launched the holiday season Friday and will remain away from classrooms until Jan. 2. They were joined by dozens of college students re turning home to spend Christ mas with their families.

Carolina Sportswear, the county's largest industrial plant, will begin its holiday with a Christmas party for employees shortly before noon Tuesday. The plant will be closed Tuesday afternoon and Christmas Day.

County offices in the Court house, except for emergency services, will be closed Christmas Day through Sunday Dec. 29. The office of the Superintendent of Schools, also located in the Court house, will be closed Christmas Eve through Sunday.

Building Contracts 'Too High'

Construction of an administrative office building to serve the Warren County school system received a setback Thursday night when members of the Warren Board of Education refused to approve contractors' b i d s amounting to \$47.978.

The proposed cost of the building, as reflected in bids opened earlier Thursday, came as a surprise to members of the five-man board. Architect's fees would run the cost of the building above \$50,000. while only some \$35,000 had been earmarked for the building.

Supt. J. R. Peeler was instructed to negotiate with low bidders, in an effort to bring costs in line with the earlier figure given the board.
