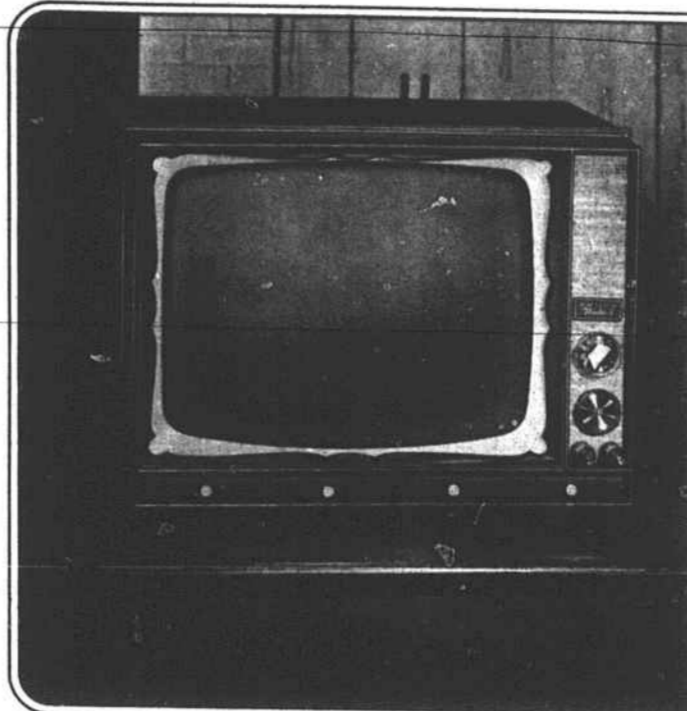

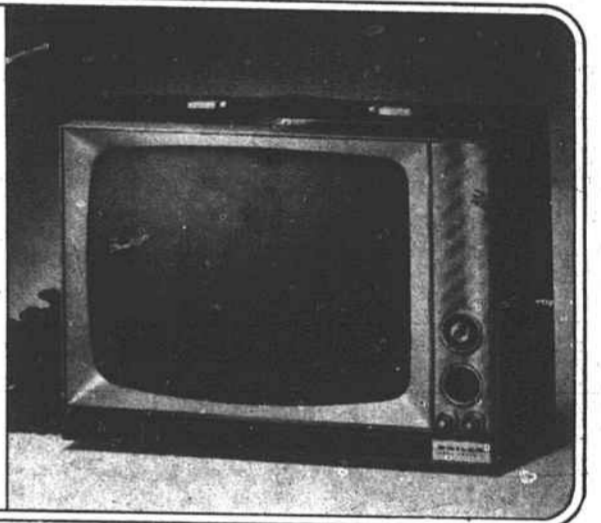

## Mrs. Gray Honored At Baby Shower

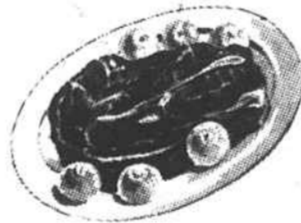
