Irrigation Is Built Largely Around Farm Ponds, Says White

Irrigation in Warren County is built largely around farm ponds. Only three farmers owning irrigation systems in Warren County do not have a farm pond, and one of these plans to construct one in the near future.

hurt a tough stem, but complete wetting might cause serious damage. Varsol is similar to gasoline, except it is not as explosive—but, don't strike a match close to it. Use at full strength — it won't mix with water.

tilizer such as 8-8-8 at the rate of 20 pounds per 1,000 square feet in March and again in early October. Sunlight is also important; you may need to remove some trees or remove low limbs.

If you tear up the lawn, use sand or organic matter such as peatmoss or well rotted sawdust. This will tend to open up the soil and provide for better aeration.
