Four DD Cases In Rec. Court

were tried in Warren County Recorder's Court last Friday in a session principally engaged in trials of violators of the motor vehicle laws.

Willie Christmas pled guilty to a charge of drunk driving and was sentenced to the roads for 60 days. The sentence was suspended for two years upon condition that the defendant not violate any motor vehicle laws of North Carolina for two years, not operate a motor vehicle upon the highways of North Carolina for one year, pay a \$100 fine and court costs

Albert Perry pled guilty to a drunk driving charge and was ordered to pay a \$100 fine and court costs.

Walter Fields pled guilty to a drunk driving charge and was ordered to pay a \$100 fine and court costs.

Minnie Silver pled guilty to a charge of drunk driving but appealed her case to Superior Court, when she was ordered to pay a \$100 fine and court costs. Appearance bond was set at \$125.00.

Joe Syrus Lee, Jr., pled guilty to a larceny charge and was given a 30 days suspended sentence. The sentence was suspended and the defendant was placed on probation.

Al Plummer was sentenced to the roads for 60 days when he pled guilty to a charge with a deadly weapon. The sentence was suspended and the defendant was placed on probation.

Reddrick Short, charged with failure to stop at the scene of an accident and with reckless driving, has died. His case was dismissed.

Ozell Roberson was ordered to pay a \$25.00 fine and court costs when he pled guilty to reckless driving.

Ellis Murrel Brooks was found guilty on a charge of reckless driving. Judgment was continued for one year upon condition that the defendant not violate any motor vehicle laws of the state for one year and pay court costs.




