Children Under 16 Not To Work On Farms During School

Raleigh - Farmers in this area were reminded today that children under 16 years of age are permitted to work on farms only outside school hours, under federal law.
This word came from Julian E. Parker, field office supervisor of the Raleigh-East office of the Wage and Hour and Public Contracts Divisions, U. S. Department of Labor. He said the Fair Labor Standards Act prohibits minors under 16 from working in agriculture during school hours for the school district where they live while working. This applies to children of migratory workers as well as local children.
"The place for children is in school, not in the fields," Parker added. "Today's children will grow up in the world which demands more education and better skills. Schooling now will open the door to opportunity in the future."
Parker pointed out that the 16-year age minimum does not apply to children who work on the home farm for their parents or guardians. He also said the Act places no restrictions on farm work by minors 16 years old or over.
Compliance with the Fair Labor Standards Act does not excuse noncompliance with State or local laws.
"The Wage and Hour Office in Raleigh will be glad to answer any questions about the Fair Labor Standards Act," Parker added. The address is Room 203, 320 South Salisbury Street, Raleigh, North Carolina.
