**Children Under 16** Not To Work On

Raleigh - Farmers in this area were reminded today that children under 16 years of age are permitted to work onfarms only outside school hours, under federal law.

This word came from Julian E. Parker, field office supervisor of the Raleigh-East office of the Wage and Hour and Public Contracts Divisions, U. S. Department of Labor. He said the Fair Labor Standards Act prohibits minors under 16 from working in agriculture during school hours for the school district where they live while working. This applies to children of migratory workers as well as local children.
