Weldon Downs Norlina

Weldon—The Weldon High School "Tornadoes" added the Roanoke Athletic Conference baseball crown to their football and basketball championships here on Wednesday afternoon of last week by defeating Norlina 1-0.

David Merritt pitched all the way to get the win. He allowed only one hit, walked two and struck out five Norlina batters. Merritt led off the winning rally with a single. Luther Cochran ran for him as the coaches for both teams had agreed to allow their pitchers to have a pinch runner. Cochran scored the winning

run on an error, a hit by Roy Lee Jones, and was driven home by Archer Harrell. Charles Draffin pitched all the way for Norlina. He gave up one run, three hits, walked four and struck out seven in the losing case.

The "Tornadoes" took the first of its two wins in the best of three Conference playoffs by defeating Norlina on its home field by a 2-0 score in the ninth inning. Stanley Mabrey pitched the win for Weldon. He allowed no runs on three hits, walking three and striking out 10. John Moody took the loss

for Norlina. He gave up two runs on seven hits, walking one and fanning five.

Weldon's two winning runs in Tuesday's game came in the ninth on a single by Terry Frazier, a sacrifice by David Merritt, a triple by Roy Lee Jones and a single by Archer Harrell.

During the regular season Weldon won the eastern division of the Roanoke Conference with a 5-1 record while Norlina won, the western division with a 7-1 record.
