Bank Earnings

W W. Shaw, president of the Peoples Bank and Trust Company, has reported that net operating earnings for the first nine months of the year rose to a record \$499,902.38 or \$2.17 per share - up 39.3% from the \$358,809.69, or \$1.56 per share, earned in the same period of 1966.

Assets, deposits and loans also reached levels substan-tially above those of a year ago. Deposits rose to \$73,-788,341.38 from \$69,274,-937.35 as of September 30, 1966, an increase of 6.5%. Losns rose from \$45,067,-430.87 to \$49,083,410.16, an ncrease of 8.9%.
