

To Erect Marker At Littleton

LITTLETON - A historical marker, showing the site of Person's Ordinary in Littleton will be dedicated on Sunday, Sept. 14, at 4 p. m., under the sponsorship of the Littleton Woman's Club.

Dr. H. G. Jones, Director of the North Carolina Department of Archives and History, will make the presentation.

All interested persons are invited to attend by the Littleton Woman's Club, which released the following brief history of the Ordinary:

Person's Ordinary, site of the old coach stop, was in North Carolina, stands on its original site, now part of the school grounds in Littleton, facing Warren Street. This was originally the old Hillsborough-Halifax Post Road, one of the oldest roads in this section of the State. The Ordinary is now leased to the Littleton Woman's Club.

Person's Ordinary was built in 1770 on the original grant of land to William Person from Charles II, through the Earl of Granville, one of the Lords Proprietors. This land was a royal grant before the Revolutionary War.

Person's Ordinary is a quaint pre-revolutionary structure, built as a coach stop, it had a wing on the right side and was surrounded by cedar and oak trees. It served both as a relay station and an Inn. It was the last stop before reaching Halifax and was, therefore, an important one. It is a well-established fact that a horn blown in Vaughan, five miles to the West, could be heard at the Ordinary in Littleton, in time for a fresh team of horses to be brought in and made ready to carry the stage coach on its journey to Halifax and, thence, to Petersburg. Uncle Essex Skinner, who belonged to the Skinner family in Littleton, was one of the coach drivers, and the Woman's Club is fortunate enough to have a picture of him, sideburns and all, which hangs in the Ordinary now.

Many are the stories that have been told about Person's Ordinary and of the notables who stayed there. Tradition says that Lafayette stopped there—we know that Aaron Burr, Horace Greeley, Lord Tarleton and Lord Cornwallis were guests of the Ordinary.
