Irrigation Makes Big Difference In Agricultural Research Project

"You know there's something wrong when at the end of June the tobacco is taller than the corn," said Hester Vernon, Carolina Power & Light Company agricultural development engineer.

Vernon was looking at some corn grown under normal conditions as part of the agricultural research being conducted near Elizabethtown, N. C., by CP&L, the Bladen County Peanut Committee and Bladen County Extension Service.

Next to the corn grown without irrigation was a plot of tall, healthy, green corn stalks grown with the help of irrigation. From April 22 to July 1, only 5.2 inches of rain had fallen on the experimental plots. On some plots the rainfall has supplemented with 6.6 been inches of irrigation.

There also has been preliminary success fertilizing the corn with an irrigation system. "The advantage over the conventional method is we can apply the nitrogen to the crop when it really is needed," said Steve Walker, CP&L irrigatin specialist. Corn is not irrigated to any

extent in North Carolina. As a result, a dry spell can be devastating, according to Vernon. "Some farmers will be lucky to get back more than the price of their seed because of the dry spell during the first few months of this year's growing season," he said. Vernon added, "A farmer

needs to harvest approximately 100 bushels an acre for a profit. One long dry spell can cut a farmer's yield in half or more." Corn is also being grown

without tilling the soil. "Planting without tilling is the coming thing," Vernon said. "Instead of making three or four trips across the land with his tractor, the farmer needs to make only one."

The experimentation is important because the demand for corn is increasing within the Carolinas. "The more farmers turn to raising livestock, the

The fall webworm can cause extensive damage to many kinds of trees. The worms live in colonies protected by a web attached to the tree branches. They can be easily spotted and should be eradicated before they

defoliate large tree sections. Spray with Sevin or malathion, according to directions given on the container.

Some like to burn them out using a wad of cloth on the end of a pole saturated with kerosene. If you use this method. employ which thrusts with the in order not to damage the foliage more than neces-

Bearded iris may be lifted and divided anytime between mid-July and early Sept. If you have not lifted and divided the rhizomes in the last three years, the plants are probably becoming crowded and should receive attention.

Prepare soil well and add about one measuring cup of an 0-14-14 fertilizer to 10 square feet of bed space. Choose a sunny location as the plants will do better in sun than in shade.

When planting, cover the rhizomes with about one inch of soil. Keep free of weeds and watered at all times. Earlier plantings become established in the soil and bloom better the following spring.
