**Irrigation Makes Big Difference In Agricultural Research Project**

"You know there's something wrong when at the end of June the tobacco is taller than the corn," said Hester Vernon, Carolina Power & Light Company agricultural development engineer.

Vernon was looking at some corn grown under normal conditions as part of the agricultural research being conducted near Elizabethtown, N. C., by CP&L, the Bladen County Peanut Committee and Bladen County Extension Service.

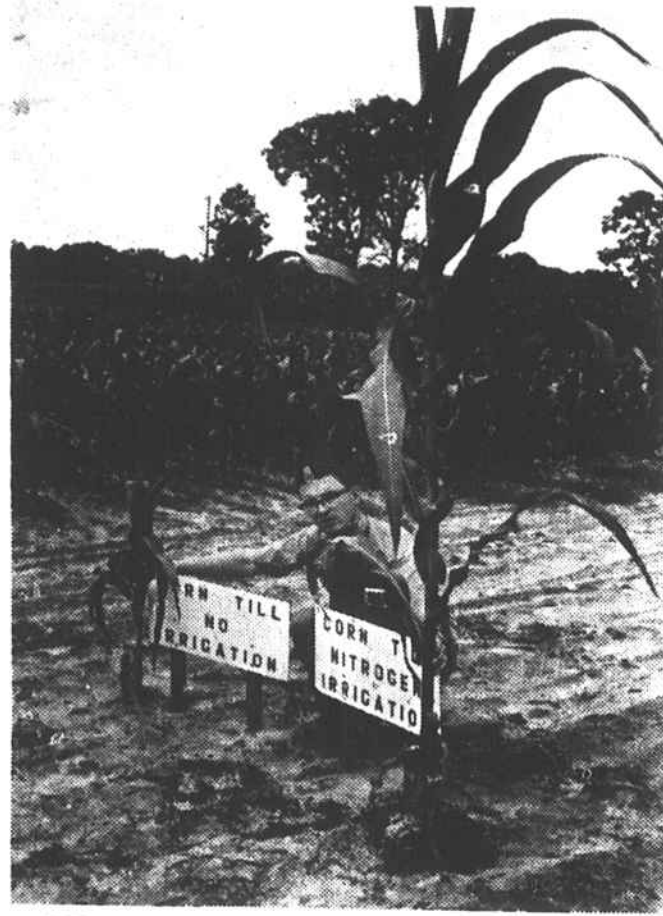
Next to the corn grown without irrigation was a plot of tall, healthy, green corn stalks grown with the help of irrigation. From April 22 to July 1, only 5.2 inches of rain had fallen on the experimental plots. On some plots the rainfall has been supplemented with 6.6 inches of irrigation.

There also has been preliminary success fertilizing the corn with an irrigation system. "The advantage over the conventional method is we can apply the nitrogen to the crop when it really is needed," said Steve Walker, CP&L irrigation specialist.

Corn is not irrigated to any extent in North Carolina. As a result, a dry spell can be devastating, according to Vernon. "Some farmers will be lucky to get back more than the price of their seed because of the dry spell during the first few months of this year's growing season," he said.

Vernon added, "A farmer needs to harvest approximately 100 bushels an acre for a profit. One long dry spell can cut a farmer's yield in half or more."

Corn is also being grown without tilling the soil. "Planting without tilling is the coming thing," Vernon said. "Instead of making three or four trips across the land with his tractor, the farmer needs to make only one." The experimentation is important because the demand for corn is increasing within the Carolinas. "The more farmers turn to raising livestock, the

more they will need corn," Vernon said. "Farmers can replace lost tobacco income and minimize their labor requirements by growing corn on a profitable basis."

Some of the experiments involve peanuts and soybeans. "We will be trying to prevent leaf spot by injecting a fungicide through irrigation on the peanuts rather than driving over the peanut vines applying a

dust or spray by conventional method," said Jack Cullipher, Bladen County Extension agent. Peanuts and soybeans also are being grown by the no-till method.

CP&L, the Extension Service, and the Bladen County Peanut Committee invite area farmers to stop by the experimental plot at the junction of routes 701 and 242 south of Elizabethtown.

**Tobacco Production Forecast Is Up**

**RALEIGH** — Production of five-cured tobacco is forecast at 705 million pounds by the North Carolina Crop Reporting Service. If this estimate materializes, the 1970 crop would be 1.3 percent above the 1969 crop of 695,665,000 pounds. This is the first forecast for the season and is based on reports from growers about July 1.

Flue-cured growers expect to harvest 382,500 acres—4,000 acres or 1.1 percent more than the 378,500 acres harvested last year. The expected North Carolina average flue-cured yield for

all types combined is 1,843 pounds—or 5 pounds above the average of 1,838 pounds per acre realized in 1969.

There are one or two July even: that some of my readers may be interested in attending. It happens that both of these are in the same location and could be visited with one overnight stay.

Both are in Greenwood, South Carolina. On July 24, there will be a "Beauty Line-In" co-sponsored by the South Carolina Festival of Flowers and the Garden Club of South Carolina, as a part of the Third Annual Festival of Flowers activities in Greenwood.

The fall webworm can cause extensive damage to many kinds of trees. The worms live in colonies protected by a web attached to the tree branches. They can be easily spotted and should be eradicated before they

defoliate large tree sections. Spray with Sevin or malathion, according to directions given on the container.

Some like to burn them out using a wad of cloth on the end of a pole saturated with kerosene. If you use this method, employ which thrusts with the flame in order not to damage the foliage more than necessary.

Bearded iris may be lifted and divided anytime between mid-July and early Sept. If you have not lifted and divided the rhizomes in the last three years, the plants are probably becoming crowded and should receive attention.

Prepare soil well and add about one measuring cup of an 0-14-14 fertilizer to 10 square feet of bed space. Choose a sunny location as the plants will do better in sun than in shade.

When planting, cover the rhizomes with about one inch of soil. Keep free of weeds and watered at all times. Earlier plantings become established in the soil and bloom better the following spring.
