puty Sheriff Dorsey Capps. Capps said that the boys had allegedly stolen a car in Granville County and had wrecked it near the home of Kearney. They abandoned the car and were attempting to push an automobile from the home of Kearney when they were detected. Kearney held Troublefield at gunpoint until the arrival of Deputy Capps. Capps soonpicked up the juvenile and brought both boys to Warrenton where they were picked up by Granville officers that morning.
