Mayor W. A. Miles issued a proclamation today for the Little Garden Club of Warrenton to sponsor an anti-litter campaign in Warrenton.

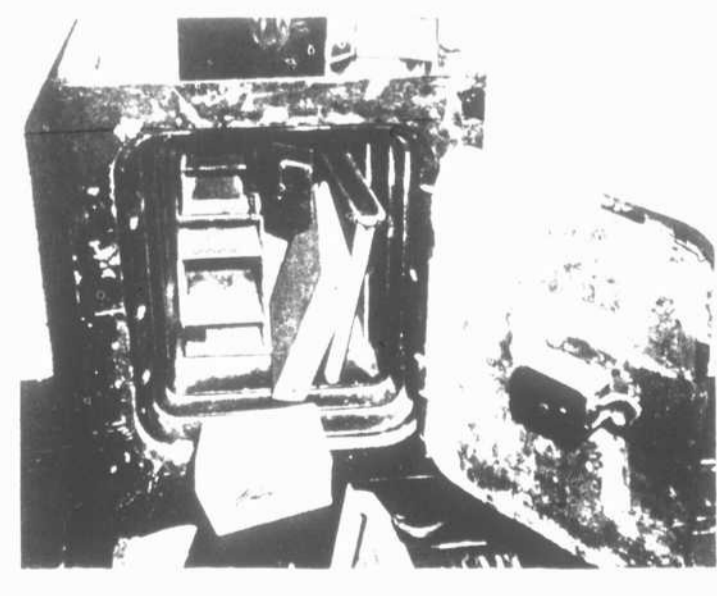

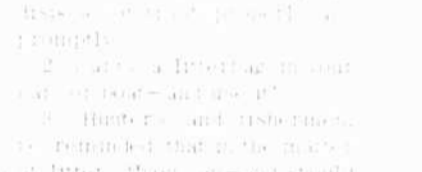
Planning Board Chairman Is Honored By Lions
