Waivers And Continuations Reduce Size Of Large Warren District Court Docket

Eighty cases originally set for trial Friday in Warren County District Court shrank to 56 before the session ended as 16 continuations and eight waivers reduced the number heard.

Judge Julius Banzet of Warrenton presided over the session in which the following cases were disposed of:

Bobby Gene Alexander. trespass, voluntary dismissal. On a charge of assault with a deadly weapon, he was found guilty of simple assault and ordered to jail for sixty days, suspended for two years on condition that he not go on premises of Lou Jiggetts for two years, that he keep the peace toward all persons, particularly Lou Jiggetts and that he pay cost of court, including attorney fees.
